


JENNA BENNETT

The main character was named by the winner of Author for Fireys 'auction', which raised money to support the Fireys (Aussie slang for firefighters), families, and small businesses who had lost everything in the South Australian fires of 2020. The Aunt Enid Mysteries is set (mostly) in the Adelaide Hills, not far from the Cudlee Creek fires. Fires also devastated more than a third of Kangaroo Island, destroying homes, lives, and wildlife (including precious bees).
